2. Service provider

The Bidder having submitted the lowest price and whose offer is substantially responsive to the requirements specified shall be selected for award of contract and referred to as the Service Provider.

3. Rights of the Public Entity

The Ministry of Mines and Energy shall have the right to

- (a) Ask for clarifications at time of evaluating quotations and
- (b) Reject all quotations.

A Ministry of Mines and Energy shall not be bound to accept the lowest or any quotation.

4. Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to participate in this Quotation exercise, you should:

- (a) have a valid company Registration Certificate; (Certified by Namibia Police)
- (b) have an <u>valid original /certified copy of good</u> Standing Tax Certificate, (Certified by Namibia Police)
- (c) have an <u>valid original /certified copy of g</u>ood Standing Social Security Certificate, (Certified by Namibia Police)
- (d) have a **valid certified copy** of Affirmative Action Compliance Certificate, proof from Employment Equity Commissioner that bidder is not a relevant employer, or exemption issued in terms of Section 42 of the Affirmative Action Act, 1998, (Certified by Namibia Police)
- (e) Complete and sign the attached **Bid-securing Declaration**.
- (f) Complete and sign an undertaking on the part of the Bidder that the salaries and wages payable to its personnel in respect of this proposal are compliant to the relevant laws, Remuneration Order, and Award, where applicable and that it will abide to sub-clause

5. Bid Securing Declaration

Bidders are required to subscribe to a Bid Securing Declaration for this procurement process. The bidder shall furnish as part of its quotation, a Bid Securing Declaration as per the format contained in Schedule 1 of this document

6. Prices

Prices shall be quoted in Namibia Dollars. Prices quoted shall be firm and fixed during validity period of quotation and for execution of contract.

7. The Contract

The letter of Acceptance/Purchaser Order Form as the case may be together with this Informal Quotation form shall constitute the contract between the Ministry of Mines and Energy and the Service Provider.

8. Purchase order

A supplier to whom a purchase order is issued must confirm the purchase order within three days of receipt of the purchase order and;

- (a) may not change or alter the terms of the purchase order; and
- (b) must undertake to deliver the goods on or before the date set in the purchase order for delivery of the goods.
- (c) the purchase order shall be valid for 30 days only and will be cancelled thereafter.

9. General Conditions of Contract

The general terms and conditions shall be as per the General Conditions of Contract (Goods) Ref. No: NCS/IQ/15-12/2023 posted in the website of the Policy Unit and on the Ministry of Mines and Energy's website.

10. Warranty

The Service provider warrants that the services shall conform to the standards, specifications and related services as defined by the Purchaser in its Invitation for Informal Quotation subject to any alternative proposal made by the Service provider in its response to the Purchaser's Invitation for Informal Quotation.

11. Payment

The Employer undertakes to effect payment within [30 days] days after completion of the services to the satisfaction of the client subject to the Service Provider making goods all defects and submitting all required

documents to initiate payment. Final payment shall be adjusted to reflect any noncompliance in the execution of the contract.

12. Project Manager

The Project Manager is the person appointed by the Employer responsible for supervising the execution of the services and administrating the contract.
