SECTION I: INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Rights of Public Entity

The Ministry of Industries, Mines and Energy reserves the right:

- (a) to split the contract as per the lowest evaluated cost per site, or
- (b) to accept or reject any quotation or to cancel the quotation process; and
- (c) reject all quotations at any time prior to contract award.
- (d) to award more than one bidder based on lots.

2. Preparation of Quotations

You are requested to quote for the services mentioned in Section III, by completing, signing and returning:

- (a) the Quotation Letter in Section II with its annex for Bid Securing Declaration, where applicable;
- (b) the Priced Activity Schedule in Section IV;
- (c) the Specifications and Performance Standards in Section V; and
- (d) any other attachment as deemed appropriate.

You are advised to carefully read the complete Request for Quotations document, including the Contract Data Sheet in Section VII, before preparing your quotation. The standard forms in this document may be retyped for completion but the Bidder is responsible for their accurate reproduction.

3. Validity of Quotations

The quotation validity period shall be for **90 days** from the date of submission deadline.

4. Eligibility Criteria

To be eligible to participate in this Quotation exercise, you should:

- a) have a **valid certified** company Registration Certificate; **(certified by Namibian police)**
- b) have an **original/certified copy** of a valid good Standing Tax Certificate; **(certified by Namibian police)**
- c) have an **original/certified copy** of a valid good Standing Social Security Certificate; **(certified by Namibian police)**
- d) have a **valid certified copy** of Affirmative Action Compliance Certificate, proof from Employment Equity Commissioner that bidder is not a relevant employer, or exemption issued in terms of Section 42 of the Affirmative Action Act, 1998; **(certified by Namibian police)**

- e) Complete and sign an **undertaking on the part of the Bidder** that the salaries and wages payable to its personnel in respect of this proposal are compliant to the relevant laws, Remuneration Order, and Award, where applicable and that it will abide to sub-clause 4.6 of the General conditions of Contract if it is awarded the contract or part thereof.
- f) Complete and sign attached Bid Securing declaration.
- g) All pages of the bidding documents should be initialled where possible.
- h) Have a valid good standing certificate with local authority, municipality or town council to operate a business in that specific town/city.
- i) Proof of qualified and experienced technicians (CV'S and certification).
- j) Bidder must attach a Social Security Statement of their employee's report. Therefore, the employees stated above should appear on the Social Security statement list.
- k) Detailed equipment list (computerized balancer, air-compressor, laser alignment machine, battery tester, etc.).
- I) Attach two 2 reference letters of providing similar services from previous or current clients. All reference letters must have contact details, signed, stamped and dated by the Accounting Officer of the entity. The Ministry will verify the authenticity of the reference letters attached on the bid by directly contacting the clients.

5. Bid Security/Bid Securing Declaration

Bidders are required to subscribe to a Bid Securing Declaration for this procurement process.

6. Services Completion Period

The completion period for services shall be [36 months] after contract signing. Deviation in completion period shall not be accepted.

7. Documents to be submitted

Bidders shall submit along with their quotation documents giving company's profile, past experience and evidence of similar services provided together with customers reference details.

8. Sealing and Marking of Quotations

Quotations should be sealed in a single envelope, clearly marked with the Procurement Reference Number, addressed to the **Ministry of Industries**, **Mines and Energy** with the Bidder's name and contact information at the back of the envelope.

9. Submission of Quotations

Quotations should be deposited in the Bid Box located at Ministry of Industries, Mines and Energy, 6 Aviation Road, Ground Floor, Block F1: not later than 20 October 2025 at 10h00. Quotations by post or hand delivered should reach 6 Aviation Road by the same date and time at latest. Late quotations will be rejected.

Quotations received by e-mail will not be considered.

10. Opening of Quotations

Quotations will be opened internally by the Public Entity immediately after the closing time referred to in section 9 above. A record of the Quotation Opening stating the name of the bidders, the amount quoted, the presence or absence of a Bid Securing Declaration, will be provided on Bidder's request within three working days of the Opening.

11. Evaluation of Quotations

The Public Entity shall have the right to request for clarifications in writing during evaluation. Offers that are substantially responsive shall be compared on the basis of evaluated cost to determine the lowest evaluated quotation.

12. Scope of services, Specifications and Performance Standards

The Scope of Services and Performance Standards Compliance Sheet detailed in Sections III and V are to be complied with. Bidders may propose alternative for part of the scope substantiating that such alternatives will equally serve the interest of the Public Entity.

However, evaluation will be carried out as per the defined scope. Alternatives will only be considered from bidders having submitted the lowest evaluated quotation as per the base requirements.

Bidders have to substantiate in what manner the deviation in set specifications and performance standards, if any, are not material deviation.

13. Prices and Currency of Payment

Prices for the execution of services shall be fixed in Namibian Dollars as quoted. Quotations shall cover all costs of labour, materials, equipment, overheads, profits and all associated costs for performing the services, and shall include all duties. The whole cost of performing the services shall be included in the items stated, and the cost of any incidental services shall be deemed to be included in the prices quoted.

14. Margin of Preference

SECTION III: SCOPE OF SERVICES

Provision of Supply and Fitting of Tyres, Batteries and Related Services for MIME Vehicles (36 Months)

1. Background

The Ministry of Industries, Mines and Energy (MIME) operates a fleet of government-owned vehicles across all **14 regions of Namibia**. These vehicles are instrumental in facilitating the Ministry's service delivery mandates, including outreach, inspections, and administrative duties. To ensure their operational efficiency and roadworthiness, MIME seeks to engage qualified and registered service providers on an on-demand basis to provide vehicle with the supply, delivery, removal, fitment of tyres, Batteries and related services for the Ministry's fleet across all 14 Regions.

2. Scope of Services

The scope includes the supply, delivery, fitting, balancing, wheel alignment, rotation, puncture repair, and disposal of old tyres and batteries for the Ministry's vehicles across all 14 regions of Namibia.

Vehicles include but not limited to: Toyota pick-ups (majority of fleet), Nissan pick-ups, Isuzu pick-ups, Volkswagen, Peugeot, and other light vehicles and SUVs.

The contract shall cover:

- **Tyres**: New, premium-quality tyres matching OEM specifications for size, load index, and speed rating.
- **Batteries**: New, maintenance-free batteries matching OEM specifications for voltage, capacity (Ah), Cold Cranking Amps (CCA), and terminal configuration.
- **Services**: Fitting, balancing, wheel alignment, tyre rotation, puncture repair, battery testing and diagnostics, battery installation, and programming (for vehicles with Battery Management Systems BMS).
- **Related Items**: Vehicle Rims, Valve stems, weights, battery acid (if applicable), and battery terminal protectors.

3. Standards & Compliance

- All tyres must bear the E-mark (ECE 30) or equivalent certification, proving compliance with UNECE regulations.
- All tyres must have a manufacture date of less than 3 years prior to the date of supply.
- All batteries must comply with SANS/IEC or OEM performance standards.

 All work must comply with Namibia's Road Traffic and Transport Act, Road Safety Council regulations, and all applicable Occupational Health and Safety (OHS) and environmental laws.

4. Materials & Technical Requirements

- Tyres: Must be premium brand or premium-quality equivalent (e.g., Bridgestone, Goodyear, Michelin, Continental, or equivalent). Must be radial, tubeless, and of the correct size, load, and speed rating as per the vehicle manufacturer's specification. Mixing of tyre brands and patterns on the same axle is strictly prohibited.
- Batteries: Must be from reputable brands (e.g., Willard, Delphi, Bosch, Varta, Professional or equivalent). Must be maintenance-free and sealed. The Cold Cranking Amps (CCA) and Reserve Capacity (RC) must meet or exceed the OEM specifications for each vehicle model.
- **Spare Tyres**: Must be identical in specification and brand to the other four tyres on the vehicle, unless otherwise specified by the vehicle manufacturer.

5. Installation & Workmanship

- Pre-inspection and post-installation checklists with photos/job cards required.
- Proper torque application, balancing, wheel alignment and valve replacement mandatory.
- Battery installations must include charging system test and terminal treatment.
- Mobile service units must comply with HSE standards.

6. Service Coverage & Response Times

- The Supplier must have branches or mobile fitting units in different areas/town.
- Standard Requests: Service within 48 hours.
- Emergency/Mission-Critical (e.g., puncture, flat battery): On-site service within 12 hours.
- The Supplier must maintain a sufficient buffer stock of common tyre sizes (e.g., for Toyota Hilux, Nissan, Volkswagen, Ford) and battery types.

7. Documentation & Reporting

- Job cards for each service, signed by the technician and Ministry representative.
- Pre- and post-service vehicle inspection reports (including tyre tread depth, battery health).

- Wheel alignment reports.
- Battery test reports.
- Monthly summary of services rendered per region.

8. Warranty & Guarantees

- **Tyres:** Minimum manufacturer's warranty of 12 months or 40, 000 km (whichever comes first), including pro-rata warranty and coverage for workmanship of 24 months.
- **Batteries:** Minimum manufacturer's warranty of **18 months** (free replacement period must be clearly stated).
- Defective products/services must be replaced/remedied at no additional cost to the Ministry.

9. Duration of Contract

10. Requirements and Eligibility Criteria

- 10.1. Business activity related to "Tyre Supply/repairs/maintenance" must appear on the Founding Statement/Registration Documents.
- 10.2. A fully equipped operational workshop must be available.
- 10.3. Provide proof of registration with local Town Council/Municipality and a valid Fitness Certificate for the premises.
- 10.4. Indicate the preferred town/Region of operation (from where services will be rendered).
- 10.5. The workshop must be within reasonable proximity to a MIME Regional office.

11. Technical Capacity

- 11.1. Proof of qualified and experienced technician's CV's and certificate e.g RMI, Tyre manufacturer training.
- 11.2. Bidder must attach a Social Security Statement of their employee's report. Therefore, the technician stated above should appear on the Social Security statement list.
- 11.3. Detailed equipment list (computerized balancer, air-compressor, laser alignment machine, battery tester, etc.)
- 11.4. Attach two 2 reference letters of providing similar services from previous or current clients. All reference letters must have contact details, signed, stamped and dated by the Accounting Officer of the entity. The Ministry will verify the authenticity of the reference letters attached on the bid by directly contacting the clients.
