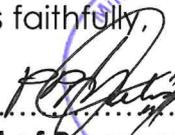

1. Rights of Public Entity

The **Ministry of Industries, Mines and Energy** reserves the right:

- (a) to split the contract as per the lowest evaluated cost per lot; and
- (b) to accept or reject any quotation or to cancel the quotation process and reject all quotations at any time prior to contract award.

2. Preparation of Quotations

7. Submission of Quotations

Quotations should be deposited in the Quotation/Bid Box located at 6 Aviation Road, Ground Floor, Block F1, not later **06 March 2026 at 10h00**. Quotations by post or hand delivered should reach 6 Aviation Road by the same date and time at latest. Late quotations will be rejected.

Quotations received by e-mail will not be considered.

8. Opening of Quotations

Quotations will be opened internally by the Public Entity immediately after the closing time referred to in section 7 above. A record of the Quotation Opening stating the name of the bidders, the amount quoted, the presence or absence of a Bid Security/Bid Securing Declaration, will be posted on the website of the Public Entity and available to any bidder on request within three working days of the Opening.

9. Evaluation of Quotations

The Public Entity shall have the right to request for clarifications in writing during evaluation. Offers that are substantially responsive shall

be compared on the basis of evaluated cost, subject to Margin of Preference where applicable, to determine the lowest evaluated quotation.

10. Technical Compliance

The Specifications and Compliance Sheet details the minimum specifications of the works to be carried out. The specifications have to be met, but no credit will be given for exceeding the specifications.

11.1 Technical Evaluation

The following criteria/technical requirement shall apply during evaluation process:

(a) Adequacy of Technical Proposal

Evaluation of the Bidder's Technical Proposal will include an assessment of the Bidder's technical capacity to mobilize key equipment and personnel for the contract consistent with its proposal regarding work methods, scheduling, and material sourcing in sufficient detail and fully in accordance with the requirements stipulated in Section V (Employer's Requirements).

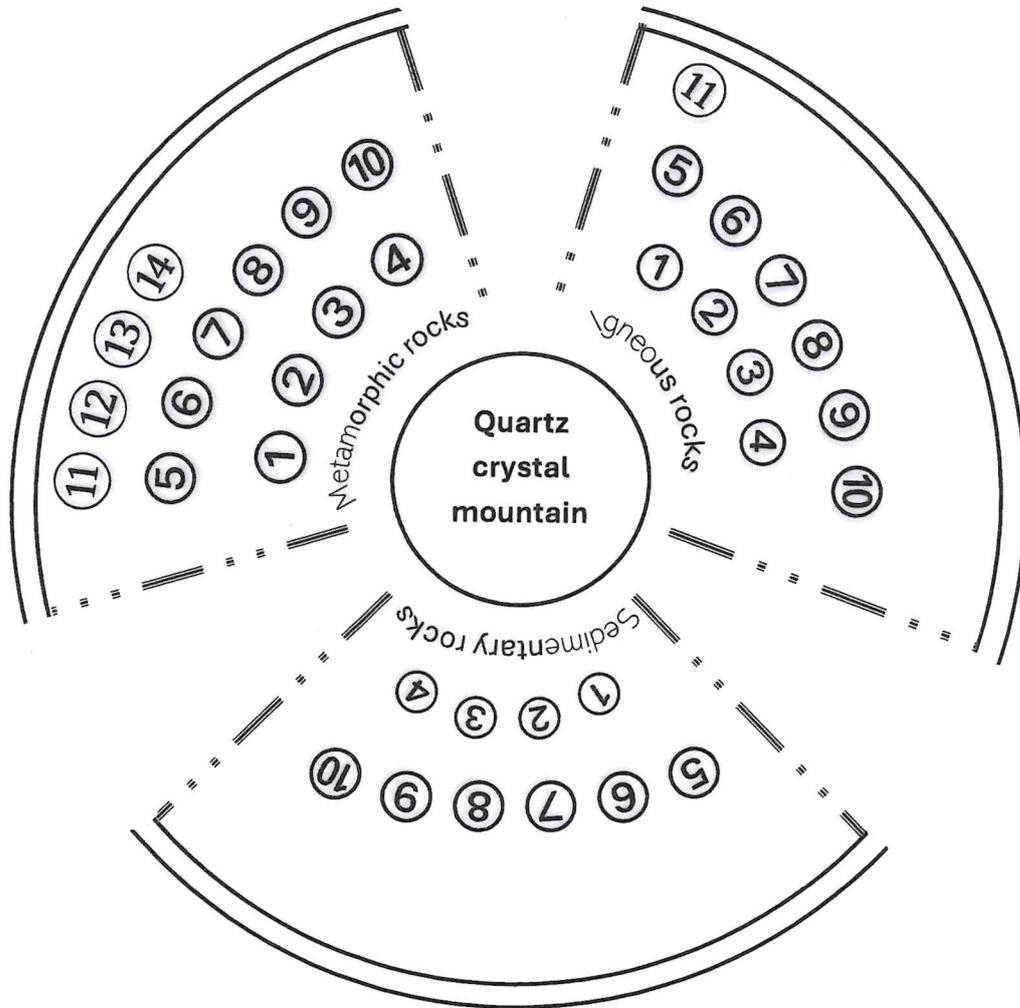

CONSTRUCTION OF GEOLOGICAL ROCK GARDEN: A WALK-THROUGH GEOLOGICAL GALLERY

1. Project Overview

Namibia boasts some of the most diverse and well-exposed geology in the world. However, these geological treasures are often locked away in remote terrains or atop inaccessible peaks. The Walk-Through Geological Gallery is designed to dismantle these physical barriers. By centralizing representative specimens of Igneous, Sedimentary, and Metamorphic rocks in a curated outdoor space, we bring the field to the people—providing a specialized laboratory for geoscientists and a window into the Earth for the general public.

This project entails upgrading an outdoor Geological Rock Garden and it will prioritise clear demarcation and circulation, weed and pest control and weather durability (sun, rain, temperature variation).

2. Geological Rock Garden Strategic Objectives

- **Geoscientific Training:** Create a reference site for geologists to study hand-specimen of rock textures and mineral compositions without the logistical costs of field expeditions.
- **Public Accessibility:** Design a "flat-ground" mountain experience, ensuring visitors, children, and people with disabilities can interact with Namibia's geological heritage.
- **Interpretive Excellence:** Use high-durability signage to translate the rock cycle (Igneous, Sedimentary, and Metamorphic rocks) and Namibia's specific crustal evolution into accessible stories for tourists and students.
- **Institutional Extension:** Act as the premier outdoor exhibition for the Ministry's Museum, doubling the institution's educational footprint.

3. Technical Implementation Strategy

To ensure the gallery functions as a scientific instrument rather than a decorative garden, the project will adhere to:

- **Precise Placement:** Specimens will be arranged according to the **Igneous, Sedimentary, and Metamorphic rocks and their Sub-divisions**, allowing visitors to "walk across the country" in a few hundred steps.
- **Specimen Integrity:** A rigorous **Tag-and-Trace** protocol will be used during the upgrade to ensure every rock retains its lithological identity and provenance.
- **Climate Resilience:** Use of UV-resistant materials and specialized drainage to protect the rocks from Namibia's harsh sun and seasonal rains.
- **Environmental Control:** Integrated pest and weed management to maintain a clean, professional aesthetic suitable for the public.

4. Rock Garden Demarcation & Flooring

A. Elevated Interlock Flooring (Perimeter & Pathways) for clearly defining the rock garden boundaries, providing durable walkways and entrance platforms, and to prevent soil erosion and weed intrusion

B. Interlock Type must be concrete interlocking pavers (Heavy-Duty Outdoor Grade). refer to simulation exhibition.

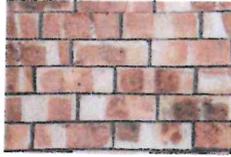
C. Interlock Colours must be theme-Aligned (Primary: Charcoal Grey, Secondary: Light Grey, Accent (banding or edging) black colour.



(Slip-resistant textured finish)

D. Elevation Specification

- Interlocks raising 200-300 mm above surrounding ground level
- Edged with precast concrete curbs (grey) around the garden only.
- Inside raised divisions should be curbed with super bricks like this; (exemplary colour) or black super bricks.



E. Extension from the rock garden with interlocked pathway to the near main building exit/entrance (curbed off with concrete curbs)

5. Sub-Base & Weed Prevention System

A. Layered Ground Preparation (from bottom up)

1. Compacted natural soil
2. Chemical pest treatment (termite & ant control – eco-approved)
3. Geotextile weed-control membrane (UV-resistant), allowing water drainage without soil movement
4. Apprx 150 mm crushed stone sub-base
5. Apprx 30–40 mm bedding sand
6. Interlocking pavers

NB! (Relate to Government standards)

6. Rock Placement & Mounting System

A. Rocks in the garden to be removed cautiously and name-tagged before and after operations, rocks should be placed strictly according to the geological map provided and adequate spacing for visibility and drainage to be maintained.

B. Rock mounting / support options should be (Outdoor-Grade).

C. Rock beds or holder options

Option A: Stabilised Gravel Beds (Small Rocks)

- Angular (grey stones) or Polar White Marble Gravel 20mm.
- Bordered with steel rust resistant or concrete edging

Option B: Concrete Plinths (Recommended for Large Rocks)

- Reinforced concrete base
- Height: 100–200 mm
- **No** paint coating: Neutral Grey (matte)
- Slight slope for water runoff

7. Rock Identification Numbering System

A. Numbering of each rock group shall have a clearly visible number corresponding to the geological map, entrance display maps, and digital explanations on the tablet.

B. Number mounting method

- 316 stainless steel round shaft rod, Ø14-16 mm with floating tag
